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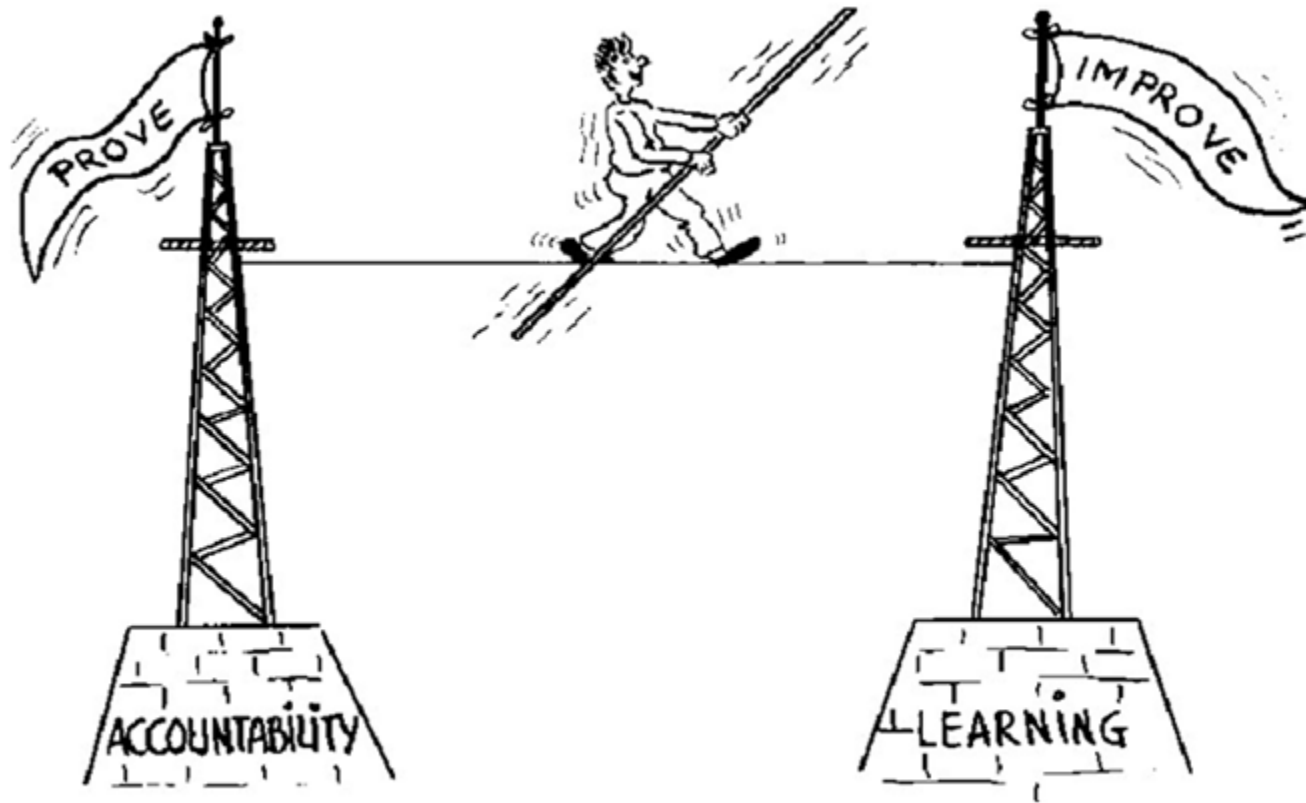

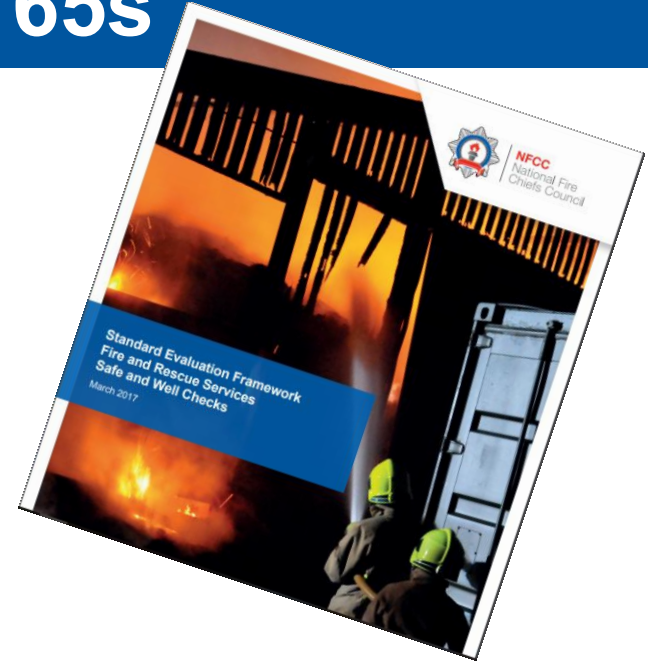

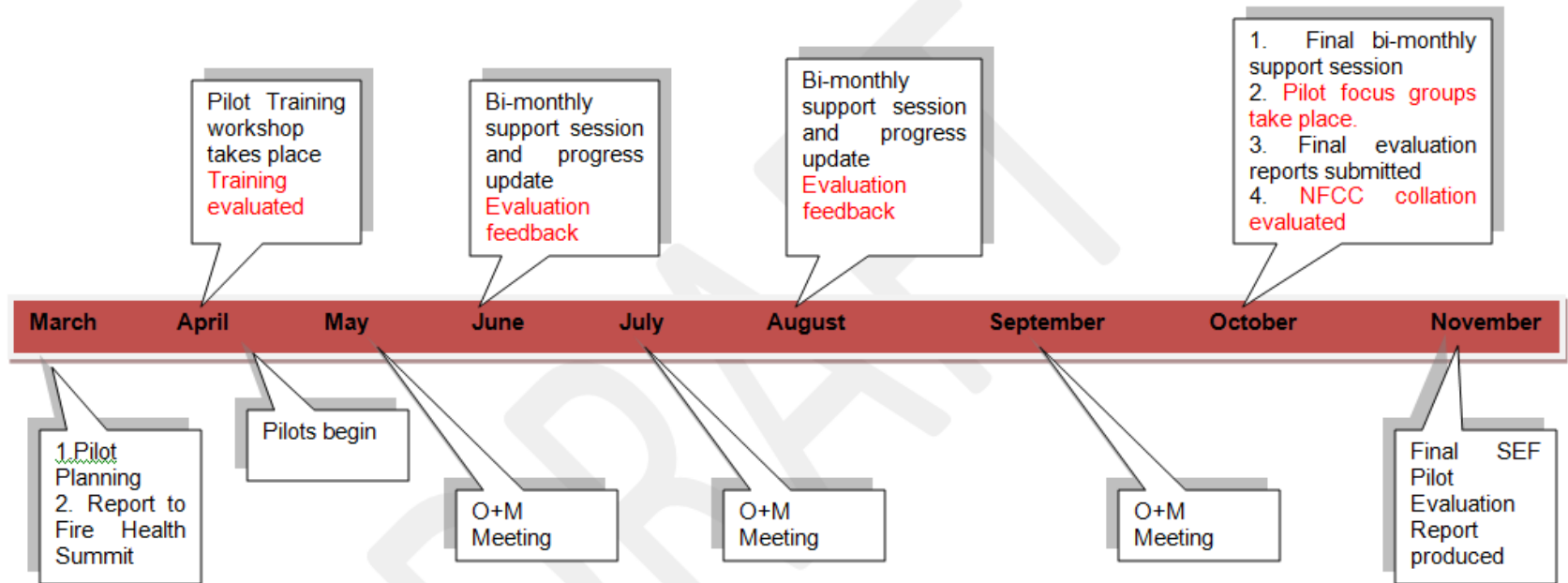

# Key Findings

- Developing SWV programmes is a significant undertaking and has resulted in system-wide benefits with large numbers of staff trained, new partnerships established, improvements to governance and enhanced reputations.
- There is no clear national approach to establishing population fire risk and FRS methodologies vary, often based on small numbers and local Fire Deaths and Serious Injury (FDSI).
- FRS would benefit from a national standard for Home Safety Visits and SWV. Many are grappling with how to quality assure their service delivery.



# Key findings Cont'd

- The majority of FRS are set up to collect data at a household level, rather than at individual level. If FRS are to move to a person centred approach current IT systems and approaches will be a significant issue.
- Achieving even basic data standardisation is a significant challenge for FRS currently. There is no equivalent system to IRS for community safety and practices are hugely varied.
- Extracting data from referral partners has been very difficult. There are also broader questions about the point at which FRS can claim an output as 'theirs'.
- The spreadsheet mechanism for centralised collation was problematic. To achieve centralised collation of data in the future alternatives will need to be considered.





# Next Steps

- Roll out of the SEF was agreed at the NFCC meeting, with support from the pilot FRS
- Overlap with work to develop new standards for Home Safety Visits
- Slight delay to enable alignment with the new Standards
